1. BACKGROUND

REED Nepal focuses on sustainability and the empowerment of the vulnerable and marginalized people of Nepal. Its goal is to help the most disadvantaged meet their priority needs through integrated improvements in education, Disaster Risk Reducation (DRR) and the environment (including climate change adaptation). It recognises that aid programs are more likely to be sustainable and effective when they are aligned with partner priorities, supported by local people, and involve beneficiaries in design and implementation.

2. GUIDELINES

All REED work will be guided by:

- Strong partnerships Taking a participatory approach with program partners and communities to understand issues from their perspective and, in partnership with them, work to deliver the outcomes they need most.
- **Empowerment** Engaging and empowering people in the communities where REED works so change is sustained.
- Alignment Working closely with national authorities to align to their policies and priorities. REED will strive to ensure that delivery partners have established, and have the capacity to further develop, associations with government agencies in the interest of sustainability. This includes: integration of program activities into existing government and community systems; and encouraging involvement of government authorities at national and district levels in designing and implementing program activities, as well as in capacity development opportunities.
- Harmonisation Working with other stakeholders/partners to reduce the minimising opportunities for duplication and fragmentation of external assistance. Improved coordination and partnerships can also provide opportunities for leveraging additional support for programs. REED Nepal will particularly ensure that its work complements inclusive quality education and poverty reduction efforts under based on the available resources from the funding agencies.
- A long-term view —Sustainability of efforts will not become evident for some time
 given the entrenched development challenges and capacity constraints facing the
 Nepal. A long-term view will build a basis for systemic change at community level in
 working towards helping people achieve their development goals. The concept of
 sustainability does not necessarily mean the discontinuation of development
 activities, but rather that the benefits are appropriate, owned by the stakeholders
 and supported on an ongoing basis with locally available resources.
- Inclusion Ensuring that those most in need contribute to and benefit from
 development opportunities through: mainstreaming a gender and social inclusion
 approach across all REED work; and ongoing development of specific approaches for
 strengthening the inclusion of girls and women, the most vulnerable young people in
 communities, and people with disabilities.

- Quality Continuous strengthening of monitoring, evaluation and learning of
 operations and programs to ensure they are: evidence-based and relevant; delivered
 efficiently and are cost effective; and incorporating learning into ongoing
 programming delivery and operational decisions. This approach will enable better
 assessment of sustainability issues and guide the phase-out stages of individual
 projects.
- Leveraging the Local Resources: REED Nepal will focus on best utilization of resources with the exploration of local resources; and promote the sustainability with the collaboration with local government and like-minded agencies.

3. PROGRAM OPERATIONS

All REED projects stem from the **needs of local communities**. To maximise the chances of meeting project goals for communities, NGO project managers will involve, and gain the support of, all members of the local community to ensure ongoing grassroots ownership of all projects.

Activities will continue to be developed and managed in collaboration with partners/stakeholders with a strong track-record in community development. This approach will help ensure that local communities are empowered and equipped to manage and support activities in an inclusive and sustainable manner. REED recognises the specific qualities, attributes and valuable role of NGOs in: mobilising public support; forging strong links with community groups; providing expertise tomeet people's basic needs where quick and flexible responses are essential; promoting accountability; strengthening the voice of and empowering communities to address their needs; promoting stronger links and transparency between governments and their citizens; and advocating for the most vulnerable members of society including the poor, women, children, people with disability and minority groups.

Inclusive **project design and implementation** arrangements will be established and managed to ensure that local NGOs/CBOs and communities are empowered and equipped to manage and support projects sustainably and inclusively. Appropriate strategies for ensuring that operations and maintenance resources can be identified to ensure that any assets contributed by the project can be continued beyond the period of program support. Activities that build on local initiative and capacity will have much better prospects for sustainability as they are more likely to have local support and can draw on community capacities both during implementation and beyond. Activities that provide scope for local stakeholders to participate meaningfully throughout the project cycle are also more likely to produce benefits that are sustainable as this fosters local stakeholder ownership and commitment. As well, enhanced multi-sectoral efforts will improve access to services and income earning opportunities in isolated communities through: linking education, income generation, health and environmental (and climate change adaptation) outcomes and operations in the communities in which REED works. This will build on established relationships with and the capacity of local communities and district authorities.

Through assistance with administration, project management, capacity development, monitoring and risk management, REED will ensure that program and project design and delivery is based on community and participant capacity and leverages their contributions, wherever possible, to enhance sustainability and local ownership. REED's risk management approaches highlight outcomes in terms of sustainability, effectiveness and efficiency. REED's Organisational and Program Risk Management Framework identifies and ranks a number of

internal and external risks for ongoing assessment and management as part of annual planning and review processes.

At a broader level, REED's *Strategic Plan 2015-2021* reflects and supports the achievement of the international **Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)** and National Priority of Nepal.
